DIRECTOR'S WELCOME

Belfast International Arts Festival returns for its 61st edition this October, bringing together today's leading artists, writers, thinkers and cultural observers for a bumper 26 days of talks, readings, exhibitions and performance from home and abroad.

This year sees a first for Festival with the event opening simultaneously on both sides of the Atlantic. Our collaboration with Cahoots NI, The Vanishing Elephant opens at the New Victory Theater on Broadway in New York (before coming home to Belfast next October 2024) whilst here in Belfast we welcome the return of Cary Mitchell, one of our bravest playwrights with his new play, Burnt Out at the Lyric Theatre.

Both these new stage works are part of a special focus on homegrown talent that also includes concerts celebrating the achievements of Conor Mitchell and the Belfast Ensemble and Cara Dillon at the Grand Opera House. New dance works are a strong feature of this year's programme with premieres from Eileen McClory (Gutter at The MAC), Suzanne McCreight and Festival Artist in Residence, Helen Hall (Crescent Arts Centre) and a durational performance installation from Vasiliki Stasinaki & Sarah Gordon, specially commissioned by Maiden Voyage Dance (good times never seemed at QSS at The Arches Centre).

Other theatrical delights include the return of the formidable Pat Kinevane and Fishamble Theatre Company with the critically acclaimed King; the hugely entertaining and provocative work.txt from one of the UK's brightest young playwrights, Nathan Ellis and a new and innovative adaptation of Rhinoceros – "Rhino" - by Eugene lonesco and from Tinderbox Theatre Company.

A major signature event at The Grand Opera House is FIQ!, an otherworldly collection of acrobatic feats, figures, colours, music, sketches, headspins, and choreography exploding in a colourful visual world from **Groupe Acrobatique de Tangers**. FIQ! is a contemporary circus show for all the family, built of modern, tumbling alchemy, set to sounds by DJ Dino and fiery rap and not to be missed!

Saturday 14 October is dedicated to celebrating Belfast's designation as UNESCO City of Music and includes renowned music agent and promoter, **Paul Charles** hosting a workshop and talking about his new book and an evening of new country music from **Aaron and Aimee Allen** (Canada) and **Gary Quinn**. The following evening sees acclaimed West End star, **Henry Goodman** alongside pianist **Lucy Parham** in *Elégie*, chronicling the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff on the 150th anniversary in 2023 of his birth.

As always, our Talks and Ideas programme strand features an array of authors talking about their latest books with events this year featuring Gary Younge, Jacqueline Crooks and Santanu Bhattacharya, Claire Kilroy and Mike McCormack, Mick Herron, Rachel Connolly and Nicole Flattery, Tom Crewe and K Patrick, Paul Charles and many others.

Also in this strand and giving a special keynote address on leadership is our Featured Artist for 2023, **Nicholas McCarthy**. Born without a right hand in 1989, Nicholas McCarthy made history when he became the only one-handed pianist ever to graduate

from London's Royal College of Music. in July 2012. Since then, he has performed extensively in the UK and internationally including for the 2015 edition of Belfast International Arts Festival. This is just one of four special events he is involved in with this year's programme with the others including a special quest appearance with the Ulster Orchestra and a special free concert at Ulster University with Nicholas appearing alongside Acoustronic, a unique collaboration between the Ulster Orchestra and the award-winning, Derry-based ensemble of young musicians founded by NI based composer, Frank Lyons.

Other free events include street theatre and outdoor circus at CS Lewis Square featuring Taroo from Said Mouhssine (Morocco) and The Cabinet of Curatrocities from Baubo Theatre (Ireland) as well as a terrific selection of art exhibitions ranging from the RUA Annual Exhibition at the Ulster Museum to a retrospective of the work of critically acclaimed NI visual artist and photographer. Victor Sloan at Belfast Exposed and a new video installation examining themes associated with women and their mistreatment by the state and the church and created in collaboration by visual artist Alison Lowry. aerial performer Kate Finegan and voice artist Jess Kavanagh at SARC.

If you missed our special programme in April to mark the 25th anniversary of the Belfast (Good Friday) Peace Agreement, then no need to worry as we're bringing back one of the most popular events from that programme; *Ellipses – An Anthem to End Wars*, a collaboration between poet Maria McManus and composer, Keith Acheson over the closing weekend of the Festival.

In this 61st festival edition, you will find reflections on the world today seen through the eyes of world class artists from home and abroad, with many opportunities to engage with questions about art, culture, community and perspective. Take a look inside and join us this October!

It also gives me a chance to extend huge thanks to my predecessor Jackie McCoy for her seven years of service ushering in a new era in the long and storied history of the Festival.

It was a year when we celebrated and articulated through a diverse programme the values of BIAF that reflect the importance we place upon global connectivity, community, access and participation, cultural diversity and contemporary arts practice. Visiting artists and events from as far afield as Australia, Canada, USA, Egypt, Palestine and Morocco sat alongside new stage works and exhibitions from homegrown artists and ensembles such as Oona Doherty,

We also continued to build and develop reciprocal relationships with sister festivals and arts organisations abroad such as Cairo's D-CAF (Downtown Contemporary Arts Festival) and the BOCAS Literature Festival in Trinidad, generously aided by British Council NI, Principal International Partner for the 60th anniversary programme.

I also want to acknowledge the dedication and hard work of BIAF's staff and volunteers who generously give their time and energy to delivering the annual programme of events for the city's residents and visitors.

For over 60 years our audiences and stakeholders have backed our vision to support the best of artistic practice from home and abroad and we are immensely grateful to you all and look forward to welcoming you to another year of exciting and hopefully some surprising events in 2023.

Belfast International Arts Festival would not be possible without the generous support of our core funders Arts Council of Northern Ireland, Belfast City Council, Tourism Northern Ireland, British Council and the Government of Ireland's Department of Foreign Affairs. We owe them and many other partners a debt of gratitude for continuing to help keep arts and culture alive in our city.







Elégie chronicles the life of composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff. Though he became an exile in 1917. Russia remained deeply rooted in his soul. His cultural identity and his longing for his homeland imbue his music, not least the many much-loved works he wrote for his own instrument, the piano. The narrative, scripted from letters and diaries, follows Rachmaninoff from his youth in Russia, through his subsequent selfimposed exile in 1917 and finally to California USA, where he died in 1943.

The concert includes many of his best-loved works for solo piano, including a selection of Preludes, Études-Tableaux and Moments Musicaux, some of his own transcriptions and the haunting Elégie, as well as works by Scriabin and Tchaikovsky.

Known internationally for her 'Composer Portraits' in words and music, pianist Lucy Parham is presenting Elégie in 2023 to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Rachmaninoff.





Through concentrated research on films as a primary source for learning about culture, gestures, and ideology, Couch creates images that look as if they were film stills. In her cinematic universe, the observation of familial, agape, and romantic love takes place in different spaces ranging from a movie theatre, a basketball court, a dining room, bathrooms, parks, restaurants, and so on. The magic is activated in these mundane spaces because of who occupies them and how they occupy them.

One of Powell and Pressburger's most experimental and audacious films. The Tales of Hoffmann is a riotous cinematic fantasy of music and dance that tells the story of a poet's three lost

THE DIRTY LAUNDRY COLLECTIVE NORTHERN IRELAND

This short film is a collaborative work initiated by visual artist Alison Lowry, aerial performer Kate Finegan and voice artist Jess Kavanadh.

Examining themes associated with women and their mistreatment by the state and the church, it attempts to untangle the visible and invisible legacy of the Magdalene Laundries and the Mother and Baby Homes, whilst exploring the female voice within Irish identity. Combining aerial performance, glass, and a soundscape captured in situ at the atmospheric Clarke Square in Collins Barracks, Dublin, this haunting performance of female subjectivity and resistance. iuxtaposes itself against its military surroundings. Although the physical apparatus of the various institutions that incarcerated thousands of Irish women and children may now be decaying, the intergenerational effects can still be felt by this generation. In this short work we ask will there ever be justice for these survivors... and what effect has this legacy had on Irish women?

Directed by Laura Sheeran, costuming is provided by threadstories and Lia Cowan, with a soundscape created in collaboration with Isaac Gibson at the Sonic Arts Research Centre in Belfast.

A screening of *Häxan*, the classic 1922 silent film written and directed by Benjamin Christensen, with a QFT-commissioned score, composed and performed live by Nick Carlisle.

Supposedly intended as a moral education tool, Häxan instead is ripe, bawdy, and more than likely to give you sympathy for the devil. Director Benjamin Christiansen took the Malleus Maleficarum - the mediaeval witch finder's handbook - and made a documentary on witches. Having it deliciously both ways, Christiansen's film gives us incubuses seducing maidens, medieval torture devices and witches' sabbaths, while also unpacking the myth of the witch as a tool of oppression. Full of sumptuous recreations - in brilliant red and blue filters - of witch burnings, goblin parties and ostentatious devilry, on its release Häxan was the most expensive Swedish film yet made. A phantasmagoria worthy of William Blake or Albrecht Durer, it's guaranteed to make you look askance at a church gargoyle and see silent film in a new light.

QFT commissioned musician Nick Carlisle to create a new score for the film's 100th anniversary in 2022. Performed alone by Nick on synthesisers ancient and modern, the score received a rapturous response following its premiere performance.

This special Belfast International Arts Festival event will allow audiences to experience *Häxan* on the big screen, accompanied by a rare live performance of Nick's remarkable new score.





Claire Kilroy's latest book Soldier Sailor is an urgent, memorable, gut-wrenching novel about motherhood, creativity and identity. Her novel All Summer was described in The Times as 'compelling ... a thriller, a confession and a love story framed by a meditation on the arts', and was awarded the 2004 Rooney Prize for Irish Literature. Her second novel, Tenderwire was shortlisted for the 2007 Irish Novel of the Year and the Kerry Group Irish Fiction Award. It was followed, in 2009, by the highly acclaimed novel, All Names Have Been Changed.

Mike McCormack is an award-winning novelist and short story writer from Mayo. His previous work includes Getting it in the Head (1996), Notes from a Coma (2005), which was shortlisted for BGE Irish Novel of the Year, and Forensic Songs (2012). In 1996 he was awarded the Rooney Prize for Irish Literature for Getting it in the Head and in 2007 he was awarded a Civitella Ranieri Fellowship. In 2016, Solar Bones won the Goldsmiths Prize and was BGE Irish Book of the Year, and in 2017 was longlisted for the Man Booker prize. His latest book This Plague of Souls is due to be published in late October 2023.

Belfast writer **Rachel Connolly's**Lazy City is an electrifying debut set in

Her debut novel Nothing Special is described as a wildly original debut novel about two young women navigating the complex worlds of Andy Warhol's Factory, and coming of age in 1960s New York.
