




































































Welcome to the 2013 edition of the Ulster Bank Belfast Festival at Oueen's.







The highly acclaimed Brazilian group PianOrquestra makes its first visit to Belfast with composers Pedro Rebelo and Justin Yang who are based at the Sonic Arts Research Centre at Oueen's.

The programme is inspired by the work of John Cage and explores the sonorities of two pianos played by 16 hands using gloves, sticks, picks, nylon, rubber, metal, wood, fabric, plastic and electronics. It also explores Cage's legacy, including the prepared piano, use of indeterminacy, everyday sound and graphic notation


American blues singer **Eric Bibb** has had an astonishing four-decade career. He has released 35 albums, appeared on numerous radio and television shows and has toured continuously.



2013 marks the centenary of the birth of William Scott (1913 - 1989).




